Shiai Categories and Schedule

(Estimated time frames include check-in, warm-up, Shiai matches and awards presentations)

Pre-K/Pee Wee Judo Shiai (4 -6 yrs):	10:00am–11:30am (2 minute matches)
Children Judo Shiai and Newaza Shiai (7-9yrs):	11:15am–1:30 pm (2.5 minute matches)
Youth Judo Shiai and Newaza Shiai (10-12yrs):	2:00 pm–4:15 pm (3 minute matches)
Teen Judo Shiai and Newaza Shiai (13-14yrs):	4:00 pm–5:30 pm (3 minute matches)
Adult Judo Shiai and Newaza Shiai (15 yrs+):	4:00 pm–5:30 pm (3 minute matches)
Pizza Party (All ages welcome):	6:00 pm–7:30 pm

Based on the final number of registered players, small divisions will be made of 3-4 players based on age, weight, rank and ability. Players may enter a second division within their own category or in the next higher category. But players may NOT compete down a category. Players may also enter the Newaza Shiai for additional grappling experience. If a player registers and can not be matched with appropriate opponents at the instructor's discretion, the player will not be charged for registration. **ALL PARTICIPANTS WILL RECEIVE AN AWARD FOR 1ST, 2ND OR 3RD PLACE.** In addition, a competitor in each Session will be recognized with the "Most Outstanding Player" Award.

Shimewaza (choke submission techniques) are allowed only if both opponents are 13 yrs or older. Shimewaza and Kansetsuwaza (joint submission techniques) are only allowed if both opponents are 15 yrs or older. Players will be informed of the rules pertaining to their division before the Shiai begins.

Our goal is to make the KJA Shiai and Awards presentations a positive experience for all members, family and friends. We recommend students compete in this in-house event before receiving instructor approval to compete elsewhere. Both students and parents of children should know that there is NO PRESSURE to compete. Competition can be a positive, learning experience for students to test themselves and enhance participation in judo.

Judo Newaza/Grappling Shiai Rules:

- Starting Position:
Opponents face each other with one knee up and with grip.
- Only one Referee per match. (Not three)
- Osaekomi for 10-14 seconds = Yuko
Osaekomi for 15-19 seconds = Wazari
Osaekomi for 20 seconds = Ippon/Win
- Shido(s) can be given for excessive “turtling” or non-engagement/avoidance.
- Shimewaza (choking techniques) for 13 years and above only.
Tap = Ippon/Win
- Kansetsuwaza (joint techniques) for 15 years and above can only be applied to elbow only. Tap = Ippon/Win
- Standing up/picking opponent up off the ground stops an armlock.
Referee will call “Mate” (Stop).
- Absolutely no slamming once standing with opponent off ground.
Slamming = Honsokumake/Instant Loss
- If there is inactivity for more than 10-15 seconds, referee can restart the players.
- Matches are 2 minutes for 12 and under with 1 minute golden score.
- Matches are 3 minutes for 13 years and above with 2 minute golden score.
